Speciality Classes

501. FABHS 18" Hunter Derby Jackpot

Base fence height offered at 18' with 2' high options.

Hunter Derby class will host a traditional two round format. The first round will be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and movement. A base score will be given first round score. One (1) bonus point will then be added to the base score for each high option attempted regardless of refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style. Scores will be announced at the conclusion of each round and a cutoff score will be announced as determined. The second round will be the Handy Round, which will be judged on performance, jumping style, quality, handiness and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. This round is likely to include tests such as rollbacks, hand gallops, and trot fences as deemed appropriate for each class. A base score will be given for the second round score. One (1) bonus point will then be added to the base score for each high option attempted regardless of refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style. The final scores from the first and second round will be combined for a total score. Pay out to the top 3 riders

2026 FABHS TOP 20 RULES

1. Entries should be completed online through www.horseshowing.com or via printed entry form mailed to Florida All Breed Horse Show 10863 Knottingby Drive, Jacksonville, Florida 32257
2. Florida All Breed Horse Show will accept Cash, Check, Credit Card & Venmo. **A 4% convenience fee will be added for all electronic payments.**
3. Riders age is to be determined as of January 1, 2026. Youth/Junior Riders are 18 & under. Adult Amateur/Amateur Riders are 19 & over. Open classes can be entered by any exhibitor and all professionals.
4. A copy of a current Negative Coggins must be provided at the 1st show and new Coggins must be provided if Coggins expires and is renewed during the show year. This is required for all animals on show grounds.
5. All horses must have a back number and be worn while mounted at all times on show grounds.
6. All Trainers, Exhibitors, Parents and Guardians must be familiar with and are responsible for adhering to the Rules and Regulations set forth for Florida All Breed Horse Show.
7. Class entries and add's should be done before the start of the class. If the gate is closed it will not reopen while class is running. Adds can be done at the gate if the exhibitor has an open check or a credit card authorization form on file in the Office. Back numbers will be marked if the account is closed out upon entering and those exhibitors will only be able to add in the office.
8. Points will be awarded as follows: First – 10, Second – 6, Third – 4, Fourth – 2, Fifth – 1, Sixth – ½, Champion – 20, Reserve Champion – 12. **Champion/Reserve Champion ribbons to be awarded for all divisions with three or more in classes. Eligibility for series awards requires participation in at least five (5) shows. Additionally, divisions must be entered a minimum of four (4) times within the series in order to qualify for that division.**
9. Any act of courtesy to any judge, official, management, owner, exhibitor, spectator, trainer, volunteer, facility member or staff member will be grounds for removal from the facility immediately. No refunds for any reason, fees can be assessed, titles and points will be forfeited for show and eligibility to return in future terminated.
10. Classes can be split or combined at Show Management's discretion. Flat classes will be split if there are 12 or more riders. Classes can also be split to prevent ring conflicts.
11. Classes can be moved from one ring to another at Show Management discretion. Announcements will be made, but it is the Rider's responsibility to be at the designated ring at the time of showing. Rings will not be unnecessarily held for missing riders for any reason.
12. NO LOOSE DOGS. All dogs must be on a leash while on show grounds. Dogs are not allowed in holding pens or show arenas.
13. NO ONE under the age of 18 may handle a stallion of any age anywhere on show grounds. All Golf Carts operators must have a VALID Driver's License.
14. A horse may be disqualified for lameness, safety, welfare or cruelty reasons by Judge or Show Officials. No fees will be refunded.
15. No unauthorized persons allowed in announcer booths or Holding areas. Holding areas may have one (1) trainer, parent and/or helper per rider.
16. There is a \$50 Non Sufficient Funds (NSF) Fee for returned checks. A second (2nd) NSF will result in future payments accepted by Cash or Venmo only. Any credit card that does not authorize payment at the show when accounts are closed will be charged a \$50 NSF fee as well.
17. The Show Office will be open on Friday from 1pm - 5pm. Saturday will be open from 6:30am to 30 minutes after the last class and Sunday from 7:30am to 30 minutes after the last class.
18. All score sheets will be uploaded to the show page on www.horseshowing.com after the show is complete.
19. Our show results are 100% online. Results for classes will be posted within 30 minutes of the office receiving and verifying the results. The active link for results and show will be posted in the office and online during each show. Division results will be posted within one hour of the office entering results and verifying the results. These times can vary and your patience is appreciated.
20. **Exhibitors/Parents/Trainers/Representatives will not be able to close out open accounts until an hour after exhibitor is completed showing and results are entered and verified in the show office. Your patience will allow the show office time to upload and verify the results to make sure your placings and billing statements are correct. This will also allow the show office to award division titles after results are verified when you check out.** Should an account be closed by exhibitor or representative less than an hour after showing last class and entries/placings are not verified, points may be forfeited and any unpaid fees still owed at end of show can be billed an additional late fee of \$50 per exhibitor/horse to collect balance owed.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

GROOMING & CONDITION

This class judges the overall presentation, health, and care of the horse—not its movement or performance under saddle. Exhibitors are evaluated on how well their horse is maintained, conditioned, and presented, demonstrating knowledge of proper horsemanship, daily care, and turnout standards.

MODEL

To be judged on conformation, athleticism, way of movement, quality, soundness & suitability for the hunter ring. Offered to Ponies (2) and Horses (Mares & Geldings 3 & 4). Classes may be combined based on entries. May be shown in Bridle (if over the age of 3) or in a Halter & Lead Rope.

HALTER/RANCH CONFORMATION

This is a conformation-based in-hand class where horses are judged on their **breed type, balance, structural correctness, muscling, movement, and overall condition**. The handler's role is to present the horse effectively and safely, but the horse is the primary focus, not the exhibitor.

COLOR

Color Class is a halter-style class judged **solely on the horse's color, markings, and overall visual appeal**, not on conformation, movement, or how the horse is handled. The purpose of the class is to highlight unique or desirable coat patterns and colors, showcasing clarity, distinctness, and quality of markings.

SHOWMANSHIP

These classes will follow AQHA Rules and Scoring; with the exception of English Attire for English Showmanship
This class is a handler-focused class judged on the exhibitor's ability to present a horse with precision, control, and professionalism. The **horse is not judged on conformation**—only on how well the exhibitor handles, presents, and turns out their horse.

RANCH GROUND HANDLING

These classes will follow ARHA Rules and Scoring

This class is a practical, ranch-inspired in-hand class designed to showcase a handler's ability to control, direct, and manage a horse from the ground using skills that reflect real working-ranch situations. The focus is on **manners, responsiveness, correctness, and willingness**—not conformation. Horse and handler should display a natural, ranch-appropriate look: clean, well-kept, and functional, without excessive grooming or show shine.

LEAD LINE (ENGLISH)

LEAD LINE (WESTERN)

Open to junior riders who are not yet trotting in a show. To be exhibited at the walk on a lead rope by an adult. Riders may cross enter into Walk. English Division will be comprised of Leadline Pleasure, Leadline Hunter Under Saddle, Leadline Equitation, Leadline Ground Poles. Western Division will be comprise of Leadline Trail, Leadline Western Pleasure, Leadline Western Horsemanship.

WALK (ENGLISH)

WALK (WESTERN)

Open to riders who are not trotting at the same show. English Division will be comprised of Walk English Showmanship, Walk Pleasure, Walk Hunter Under Saddle, Walk Equitation & Walk Poles 2 Poles to be exhibited one at a time. Western Division will be comprised of Walk Western Showmanship, Walk In Hand Trail, Walk Trail U/S, Walk Western Pleasure, Walk Horsemanship. Riders may be accompanied by adult supervision in the ring during the classes. Riders may cross enter into Lead Line.

OPEN HUNTER CLASSES (Horses will be limited to doing no more than 6 over fence classes)

FABHS 3' HUNTER - Fences to be set at 3'. Horses and Ponies ridden by Professional, Amateur or Junior riders.. Course can have oxers and combinations. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fence Hunter Round and One (1) Under Saddle Class.

JSPH 2'6" HUNTER - Fences to be set at 2'6". Horse and Ponies ridden by Professional, Amateur or Junior riders. Course can have oxer and combinations. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle Class.

FABHS 2' HUNTER - Fences to be set at 2'. Horses and Ponies ridden by Professional, Amateur or Junior riders Simple changes allowed, no oxers or combinations. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle Class.

BEGINNER HUNTER 18" - Horses and Ponies ridden by Professional, Amateur or Junior riders and not showing over 2'6" at the same show. Simple changes allowed, no gates, no oxers and no combinations. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle Class.

YOUTH & ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER CLASSES

HIGH CHILD/ADULT 3' HUNTER - Fences to be set at 3'. Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateurs or Juniors. May contain walls, gates, oxers and combinations. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle Class.

LOW CHILD/ADULT 2'6" HUNTER - Fences to be set at 2'6". Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateurs or Juniors. May contain walls, gates, oxers and combinations. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle Class.

INTERMEDIATE RIDER 2'3" HUNTER - Fences to be set at 2'3". Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateurs or Juniors. May contain walls, gates, oxers. No In and Outs. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle Class. May not show over 2'6" at the same show.

SHORT/LONG STIRRUP 2' HUNTER - Fences to be set at 2'. Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateurs or Juniors. Short Stirrup Riders are 18 & Under/Long Stirrup Riders are 19 & Over Simple verticals and flower boxes without gates. No In & Outs. Simple changes allowed. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle Class. May not show over 2'3" at the same show.

BEGINNER RIDER 18" HUNTER - Fences to be set at 18". Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateur or Junior. Simple verticals and flower boxes without gates. No In & Outs. May Trot Fences. Simple changes allowed. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle Class (this is a Walk/Trot Canter Class) May not show over 2' at the same show.

CROSS RAILS HUNTER WTC - Fences to be set at simple cross rails. Horse or Pony to be ridden by Professional, Adult Amateur or Junior Rider. No Flower Boxes, No In & Outs. Simple Changes allowed. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle WTC Class.

CROSS RAILS HUNTER WT - Fences to be set at simple cross rails. Horse or Pony to be ridden by Professional, Adult Amateur or Junior Rider. No Flower Boxes, No In & Outs. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Hunter Rounds and One (1) Under Saddle WT Class.

JUMPER SPECIFICATIONS (Horses will be limited to doing no more than 6 over fence classes)

Courses from Ground Poles to 0.65M in 2026 will be judged on an optimum time format. Courses are posted 30 minutes prior to arena start. Mpm will be posted and Time Allowed.

There are normally 3 courses posted each day, the Green Course, Yellow Course and Purple Course

For Optimum Time Format the judge has the discretion of levying a 4 second penalty for riders demonstrating excessive and dangerous speed.

High Points are calculated on from all three classes in each division

Polo shirt, boots/breeches are acceptable ring attire for all jumper classes. Jackets may be worn however, at the discretion of the exhibitor.

The Ground Poles, Crossrails and Novice Jumper classes are for green, inexperienced riders, experienced riders seeking confidence to return to the show arena and/or green horses and ponies. It is not appropriate to use these classes as a warm up for higher fence heights 0.65M

All Open classes may be ridden by professionals, juniors or amateurs, however all Jr/Ama Jumper Classes are to be ridden by Junior or amateurs only.

Higher fence heights may be provided upon request.

Classes may run in an open card format at discretion of show management.

JR/AMA GROUND POLES: Courses will be only 4 poles. All Classes in this Division will be run under an optimum time format. Open to Junior/Amateur Riders Only.

JR/AMA CROSS RAILS JUMPERS: Fences to be set as Cross Rails no higher than 12" at center. No combinations or oxers. All Classes in this Division will be run under an optimum time format. Open to all Riders

0.55M JR/AMA JUMPERS: Fences to be set at 0.55M. No combinations or oxers. All Classes in this Division will be run under an optimum time format. Open to all Riders

0.65M NOVICE JUMPERS: Fences to be set at 0.65M. No combinations or oxers. All Classes in this Division will be run under an optimum time format. Open to all Riders.

0.65M JR/AMA JUMPERS: Fences to be set at 0.65M No combinations or oxers. All Classes in this Division will be run under an optimum time format. Open to Junior/Adult Amateur Riders only.

0.75M SCHOOLING JUMPERS: Fences to be set at 0.75M. Open to all Riders.

0.75M JR/AM JUMPERS: Fences to be set at 0.75M. Open to Junior/Adult Amateur Riders only.

0.85M HOPEFUL JUMPERS: Fences to be set at 0.85M. Open to all Riders.

0.85M JR/AMA JUMPERS: Fences to be set at 0.75M. Open to Junior/Adult Amateur Riders only.

0.95M TRAINING JUMPERS: Fences to be set at 0.95M. Open to all Riders.

1.0M OPEN JUMPERS: Fences to be set at 1.0M. Open to all Riders.

YOUTH & ADULT AMATEUR EQUITATION DIVISIONS

HIGH CHILD/ADULT 3' EQUITATION - Fences to be set at 3'. Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateurs or Juniors. May contain walls, gates, oxers and combinations. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Equitation Rounds and One (1) Equitation Flat Class.

LOW CHILD/ADULT 2'6" EQUITATION - Fences to be set at 2'6". Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateurs or Juniors. May contain walls, gates, oxers and combinations. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Equitation Rounds and One (1) Equitation Flat Class.

INTERMEDIATE RIDER 2'3" EQUITATION - Fences to be set at 2'3". Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateurs or Juniors. May contain walls, gates, oxers. No In and Outs. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Equitation Rounds and One (1) Equitation Flat Class. . May not show over 2'6" at the same show.

SHORT/LONG STIRRUP 2' EQUITATION- Fences to be set at 2'. Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateurs or Juniors. Short Stirrup Riders are 18 & Under/Long Stirrup Riders are 19 & Over Simple verticals and flower boxes without gates. No In & Outs. Simple changes allowed. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Equitation Rounds and One (1) Equitation Flat Class. May not show over 2'3" at the same show.

BEGINNER RIDER 18" EQUITATION- Fences to be set at 18". Horse or Pony ridden by Adult Amateur or Junior. Simple verticals and flower boxes without gates. No In & Outs. May Trot Fences. Simple changes allowed. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Equitation Rounds and One (1) Equitation Flat Class. (this is a Walk/Trot Canter Class) May not show over 2' at the same show.

CROSS RAILS EQUITATION WTC - Fences to be set at simple cross rails. Horse or Pony to be ridden by Professional, Adult Amateur or Junior Rider. No Flower Boxes, No In & Outs. Simple Changes allowed. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Equitation Rounds and One (1) Equitation Flat Class.

CROSS RAILS EQUITATION WT - Fences to be set at simple cross rails. Horse or Pony to be ridden by Professional, Adult Amateur or Junior Rider. No Flower Boxes, No In & Outs. Division will be comprised of Two (2) Over Fences Equitation Rounds and One (1) Equitation Flat Class. (WT ONLY)

ENGLISH FLAT CLASSES:

AQHA RULES WILL APPLY

HUNTER UNDER SADDLE: Hunter Under Saddle is a rail class designed to showcase a horse with the movement, manners, and way of going suitable for traditional English hunt-seat riding. Horses should present a forward, ground-covering stride, correctness of gait, and a calm, pleasant expression. The class emphasizes movement and consistency, not speed or flashiness. Exhibitors will be required to back. Open to Youth (18 & U) and Adult (19 & Over) Riders.

EQUITATION RAIL CLASS: Equitation on the Rail is a rail class judged solely on the rider's position, form, and effectiveness, *not* on the horse's conformation. The horse must perform correctly to demonstrate the rider's skill, but the focus is the rider, not the horse. Open to Youth (18 & U) and Adult (19 & Over) Riders.

EQUITATION PATTERN CLASS: Equitation Pattern is an individual performance class where riders complete a predetermined pattern designed to showcase their riding ability, precision, position, and control of the horse. Unlike Equitation on the Rail, this class judges riders one at a time, and focuses heavily on accuracy, transitions, and correctness of form. The horse's performance supports the evaluation, but the rider is the primary subject of the class. Open to Youth (18 & U) and Adult (19 & Over) Riders.

WT GROUND POLES: The Ground Poles Class is a low-impact class with a maximum of Four (4) poles designed to evaluate the horse's willingness, rhythm, and rideability while navigating ground poles at the walk or trot. It is suitable for all ages and levels, including beginners, green horses, and riders transitioning toward trail or hunter classes. The focus is on control, consistency, and correctness—not speed.

WESTERN CLASSES (These classes are open to Youth 18 & U and Adults 19 & Over)
AQHA RULES WILL APPLY

WESTERN PLEASURE: Western Pleasure is a rail class judged on the quality of the horse's movement, manners, consistency, responsiveness, and overall way of going. Horses should appear broke, soft, and comfortable to ride, showing a calm, willing attitude and an effortless way of carrying themselves. The ideal Western Pleasure horse moves with collection, cadence, and self-carriage while remaining relaxed and responsive. Exhibitors will be required to back.

WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP RAIL: Western Horsemanship on the Rail is a rail class judged on the rider's position, form, and ability to control and present the horse, *not* the horse's conformation or breed type. The horse's movement supports the rider's performance, but the focus is on the rider's skill and correctness of horsemanship.

WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP PATTERN: Western Horsemanship is a rider-focused class where participants navigate a pre-set pattern at the walk and jog. The class emphasizes rider position, control, accuracy, and smooth execution, rather than speed or flash. The horse serves as a tool to showcase correct horsemanship.

RANCH CLASSES (These classes are open to Youth 18 & U and Adults 19 & Over)

RANCH RAIL: Ranch Rail is a Western-style rail class designed to showcase a horse's manners, way of going, responsiveness, and suitability for ranch work. The class emphasizes smooth, relaxed movement, proper cadence, and steady attitude while the horse travels along the rail. Extended gaits will be called (extended walk/extended trot). Rider position and control are also considered. Exhibitors will be required to back.

RANCH RIDING: Ranch Riding is a Western performance class designed to showcase a horse's manners, responsiveness, and smooth way of going while performing a series of patterns that reflect working ranch riding skills. The class emphasizes control, cadence, smooth transitions, and proper head carriage, simulating a horse that is quiet, safe, and effective for ranch work. This class is individually worked.

RANCHMANSHIP: Ranchmanship is a Western style pattern class designed to showcase a horse's ability to perform maneuvers from Trail, Horsemanship, Reining and Ranch Riding. Manners, responsiveness and a smooth way of going while performing a series of patterns. The class emphasizes control, cadence, smooth transitions. This class is individually worked.

RANCH REINING: Ranch reining is a western riding discipline that focuses on a horse's ability to perform advanced maneuvers with precision, responsiveness, and smoothness, reflecting skills that would be useful on a working ranch. It's closely related to traditional reining but emphasizes practical ranch work and versatility rather than just the show arena.

TRAIL

IN HAND TRAIL: is a class where the horse is led by a handler on the ground through a series of obstacles, rather than being ridden. The goal is to demonstrate the horse's obedience, manners, athleticism, and willingness while navigating practical trail-type challenges. It's often used in shows to evaluate young, green, or inexperienced horses, or horses being trained for versatility and groundwork. Walk in Hand, Walk U/S & Leadline U/S is a walk only course

WJ/WJL TRAIL: is a class where the horse is ridden through a series of obstacles that simulate challenges commonly found on trails, ranches, or natural terrain. The focus is on the horse's obedience, calmness, versatility, and athletic ability while being ridden, rather than speed.

IN HAND RANCH TRAIL: is a ground-handled class that mirrors Ranch Trail under saddle but with the horse being led rather than ridden. This allows judges to evaluate the horse's manners, athleticism, and willingness while navigating ranch-style obstacles, without the added variable of a rider. It's often used for young, green, or inexperienced horses, or horses being prepared for ranch work or ridden trail classes.

WJ/WJL RANCH TRAIL: is a Western performance class designed to showcase a horse's ability, calmness, and versatility on obstacles that mimic real-life ranch situations. Unlike a standard trail class, Ranch Trail emphasizes practical ranch work—the kind of skills a horse would need on a working ranch, while still being suitable for competition.

SPEED CLASSES:

All speed events classes will be timed with an electric timer and/or at least one stop watch.

Timing shall begin as soon as the horse's nose reaches the starting line and will be stopped when the horse's nose passes over the finish line.

Contestants may start their runs from inside the arena. The end gate will be closed once the horse enters the show ring and will not be opened until the contestant has concluded his or her run and has the horse under control. Two contest stewards will be assigned to work the end gate.

Riders must make a willful attempt to slow their horse down or stop their horse at the conclusion of the pattern. Contestants that use the end gate or arena wall to stop their horse, showing a lack of control, will receive a warning at the first occurrence and will be disqualified at the second occurrence. Crashing into the end gate or other indicators of lack of control may result in disqualification. An obvious change of pace and speed needs to be displayed at the conclusion of the pattern.

Once the contestant's name has been called to enter the arena, the horse and rider must make reasonable progress toward the gate. If the horse is refusing to enter the show ring or the rider is not making an attempt to enter the judge may start a 30 seconds timer. At the end of the 30 seconds if the judge believes that the contestant is not making progress the contestant may be dismissed. At any time, either in the holding pens or as the contestant is making their way into the show ring, if the horse and rider are out of control, rearing, or in any other way deemed unsafe by the judge or show management, they will be dismissed and receive a no time.

Once the gate is closed contestants will have 45 seconds to break the timer, if not done so contestants will be excused and receive a no time.

In the case of a tie, the horse declared the winner in the runoff must run the pattern in not more than two (2) seconds over the original time or the runoff is held again.

Contestants are not permitted a rerun if handicapped by equipment failure and/or an accident to either the rider or the horse.

BARRELS: The barrel race pattern will consist of three (3) barrels arranged in a triangle. The left and right barrel will be spaced thirty (30) yards apart and twenty (20) yards from the start/finish line. The third barrel will be spaced thirty-five (35) yards from both the left and right barrels. All three (3) barrels will be placed a safe distance from the arena fence. If the pattern is too large for a given arena, then it will be reduced five (5) yards at a time until the pattern fits the arena. Contestants may initially ride to the left (FIGURE 1) or right (FIGURE 2) barrel and then ride the remainder of the pattern accordingly. Riders may touch the barrels. However, riders knocking over a barrel shall carry a five (5) second penalty per barrel. Failure to follow the course shall cause disqualification.

TEXAS BARRELS: The Texas Race will consist of 3 barrels arranged in a straight line and spaced fifty (50') feet apart. Rider crosses the timer line weaving right or left of the barrel, continuing weaving in and out to the third barrel, and weaving back through to the time line. Five (5) second penalty added for each barrel knocked over. Failure to complete the pattern or breaking the pattern will be cause for disqualification.

ARENA RACE: The arena race pattern is to be run around one barrel. The barrel will be placed 145 to 165 feet from the start-finish line. The horse may go around the barrel either to the right or left and run back to the start-finish line. Knocking over the barrel will be a disqualification and result in a no time. If the horse runs beyond the start-finish line before going around the barrel, a no time will result.

POLE BENDING: The pole bending pattern will consist of six (6) poles arranged in a straight line and spaced twenty-one (21) feet apart. The first pole will be spaced at least twenty-one (21) feet from the start/finish line. All poles will be placed a safe distance from the arena fence. Contestants may initially ride to either the left or right (FIGURE 3) of the first pole and follow the remainder of the pattern accordingly. Riders may touch the poles. However, riders knocking over a pole shall carry a five (5) second penalty per pole. Failure to follow the course shall cause disqualification.

Pee Wee Division - Riders under the age of 9

Youth Division - Riders 18 & Under

Open Division - Open to all Riders
